

The Key I.O. Recap Excerpt, July 2019

I.O.s 16 through 19 (No More OCCB, No More OLCS)

- I.O. 16 (207-08) Vice
- I.O. 17 (208-73) Notification to OCCB
- I.O. 18 (208-23) I-Card Checks
- I.O. 19 (208-22) Warrant Checks

Here are the basic, universal changes they make:

- OCCB replaced by **Detective Bureau**;
 - OCCB-FOD (Field Operations Desk) replaced by Detective **Borough* Wheel**
 - OCCB-ISD (Investigative Support Division) is now **ISS-RTCC** (Investigative Support Section at the Real Time Crime Center)
 - ~~OCCB~~ is now **Criminal Enterprise Division**
- Wherever it said Narcotics ~~Division~~ it now says narcotics **borough**
- Gang ~~Division~~ is now Borough Gang **Squad**
- Intelligence ~~Division~~ became Intelligence **Bureau**
- Borough Vice ~~Enforcement Squad~~ is now Borough Vice **Module**
- ~~Central Warrant Unit~~ is now **Warrant Verification Desk**.
- OLCS replaced by **OMNIFORM System**,
- ~~OLCS INDEX~~ is now **COMPLAINT INDEX REPORT**.

Q. According to PG 216-01, for which of the following should a MOS not prepare an Aided Report?

- A) Person slightly injured at their own residence who is refusing medical aid.
- B) Lost adult.
- C) Emotionally Disturbed Prisoner.
- D) Runaway Child.

Answer: C)

- Choice A) is not routine sick because they are *injured*.
- Choice B) Lost adult is listed in the definition of an Aided Case.
- Choice D) is found in 215 and does get an aided.
- Now everyone knows NOT to make an aided card for a PRISONER but when the two words preceding “prisoner” are “emotionally disturbed” some of us stop reading half way through and assume that the last word, which starts with the letter “P,” says Person. They have actually asked this question 3 times in the last ten years!!

In I.O.s 16-19 there are 10 places where you call the Detective Borough or Bureau Wheel.

- In 3 of those places, the correct choice would be Detective **Borough** Wheel and in the other 7, the correct choice would be Detective **Bureau** Wheel! –and they both begin with “B”!!
- With the above EDP question in mind, let’s look at this brand new set of directives which lend themselves to an application of this tactic.
- Expect that on test day, they will present “Detective **Bureau** Wheel” where the correct choice should say “Detective **Borough** Wheel” or vice versa.

***Detective Borough Wheel versus Detective Bureau Wheel**

Instead of calling OCCB-FOD, we now call the DB Wheel (Detective Borough Wheel)

- BUT, in some places we notify the Detective **Borough** Wheel,
- AND, in some places we notify the Detective **Bureau** Wheel. Here’s how it shakes out;

Detective Borough Wheel

208-23, I-Cards

- A/O call Detective Borough Wheel, **if they’re unavailable, then** call Detective Bureau Wheel.

208-66, Felony Case Development

- D.O. refer A1 & A2 felony narcotic arrests to narcotics borough, **if closed,** Detective Borough Wheel.

212-13 Gang Intelligence Reporting

- UMOS call Detective Borough Wheel (they call Gang Unit).

Detective Bureau Wheel

207-06 Notifications & 208-69 Arrests for certain types of crimes

- D.O, for Private Carting, Offshore Gambling, etc: notify Business Integrity Commission **via** DB Wheel.

207-08 additional data (no actor):

- Found child porn or arrest for PL 263, phone notification made to Detective Bureau Wheel.

208-73 Notification to Detective Bureau

- A/O notify DB Wheel for debrief, follow-up or enhance for Vice, Drug, Guns & OC related crimes.

208-44, Prostitution

- A/O notify Borough Vice Module, **if not available,** then notify Detective Bureau Wheel.

212-55, Aided Cases Caused by Fireworks

- For all ongoing firework related investigations, PDS Detective notify Detective Bureau Wheel.

214-34, Police Action in Licensed Premise

- UMOS notify Detective Bureau Wheel for alcohol sale w/o liquor license or operating after hours.

218-23 Guns,

- Urgent need to trace firearm, contact JFTF Supv –if n/a go through DB Wheel to contact him/her.
